WHEN MAY APPLICATIONS BE FILED

The testing office accepts applications continuously.

The cut-off date is: July 14, 2015

Applications received after the announced cut-off date will be kept pending the next announced cut-off date. Do not submit your application to the California Department of Human Resources (CalHR).

THE POSITION – General Description

Under direction, in an assigned area, (1) to plan, organize, and supervise the work of a field investigation group or a group of analysts performing technical work, or (2) to assist a Senior Transportation Representative in planning, organizing, and supervising the work of an organizational unit, or (3) to conduct special investigations, studies and analyses of complex cases and enforcement problems in all phases of for-hire transportation, or (4) to be responsible for supervision of the staff of a district office in enforcing statutes administered by the Public Utilities Commission and rates, rules, regulations, orders, decisions, directions and requirements of the Commission pertaining to rail, water, air, and highway carriers, warehouse persons, motor transportation brokers, air freight forwarders, freight forwarders, and express corporations; and to do other related work.

REQUIREMENTS FOR ADMITTANCE TO THE EXAMINATION - MINIMUM QUALIFICATIONS

All applicants must meet the education and/or experience requirements for this examination by the cut off date established by the testing office.

Qualifying experience may be combined on a proportionate basis if the requirements stated below include more than one pattern and are distinguished as "Either" I, "or" II, etc. For example, candidates possessing qualifying experience amounting to 50% of the required time in Pattern I, and additional experience amounting to 50% of the required time in Pattern II, may be admitted to an examination as meeting 100% of the overall experience requirement.

Either I

One year of experience performing the duties of a Transportation Analyst III in the California state service.

Or II

Experience: Three years of responsible experience in traffic or transportation work requiring an extensive knowledge of regulatory statutes, rates, rules, and regulations, at least one year of which shall have been comparable in level to that of a Transportation Analyst III in the California state service.

And

Education: Equivalent to graduation from college. (Additional qualifying experience may be substituted for the required education on the basis of one year of experience being equivalent to one year of college. Satisfactory completion of a two-year course in traffic management or a related field in a recognized residence school, or its equivalent in a correspondence school, may be substituted for two years of the required education on a year-for-year basis.)

EXAMINATION INFORMATION

This examination will consist of an oral interview (weighted 60% of the total score) and a written exercise (weighted 40% of the total score). In order to obtain a position on the eligible list, a minimum rating of 70% must be attained in the examination process. Candidates who do not appear for any part of their scheduled examination will be withdrawn from the examination process.

The PUC reserves the right to modify the selection process as necessary to conform to administrative or business necessity.

QUALIFICATIONS APPRAISAL INTERVIEW – WEIGHTED 60%

The interview may include the following:

- A. Knowledge of:
1. Public Utilities Commission rules and regulations concerning the regulation of highway transportation companies, air, rail, and water carriers, transportation brokers, freight forwarders and express corporations.
 2. Classification, rights and responsibilities of carriers.
 3. Use and application of tariffs.
 4. Rules of practice and procedures of the Public Utilities Commission.
 5. Operating procedures and problems in transportation industry.
 6. Record-keeping methods of warehouse and transportation companies.
 7. Principles of personnel management and supervision.
 8. Investigation techniques and procedures.
 9. Rules of evidence, laws of arrest, and court procedure.
 10. Commission's Equal Employment Opportunity program objectives.
- B. Ability to:
1. Interpret and apply the provisions of the Public Utilities Code and Public Utilities Commission rules and regulations concerning the regulation of highway transportation companies, rail and water carriers, warehouse workers, and motor transportation brokers.
 2. Advise highway transportation companies of accepted record-keeping methods.
 3. Establish tactful and diplomatic relations with citizens and public officials.
 4. Effectively contribute to the Commission's equal employment opportunity objectives.
 5. Ability to establish satisfactory relations with citizens and public officials under conditions requiring considerable tact and good judgment.
 6. Ability to maintain the confidence and cooperation of those contacted during the course of work.
 7. Communicate effectively orally.
 8. Evaluate alternatives and make immediate decisions.

WRITTEN EXERCISE – WEIGHTED 40%

The written exercise may include the following:

- A. Knowledge of:
1. CPUC rules and regulations concerning the regulation of public agencies, such as transportation companies, air, rail, and water carriers, warehouse persons, motor transportation brokers, air freight forwarders, freight forwarders and express corporations.
 2. CPUC proceedings, structure, and General Orders governing transportation and telecommunications regulation.
 3. Basic legal terminology.
 4. Operating procedures and problems in the transportation and telecommunications industry.
 5. Principles of technical report writing.
- B. Ability to:
1. Communicate in written form effectively.
 2. Read and understand non-technical material (i.e., administrative memos, letters, forms, etc.).
 3. Interpret laws codes and General Orders
 4. Prepare clear, complete and concise reports.

5. Analyze data and perform research work to locate and identify problems.
6. Reason logically and creatively, while utilizing a variety of analytical approaches to resolve regulatory problems.

ELIGIBLE LIST INFORMATION

A list of eligible candidates will be established for the California Public Utilities Commission. Names of successful candidates will be merged onto the list in the order of final scores regardless of dates. Eligibility expires 18 months after it is established. Candidates must then retest to re-establish eligibility. Candidates may only test once during a 12-month period.

Veterans' Preference: Will be awarded in this examination, pursuant to Government Code Section 18973.1, effective January 1, 2014, as follows:

1. Any veteran, widow or widower of a veteran, or spouse of a 100 percent disabled veteran, who achieves a passing score in an entrance examination, shall be ranked in the top rank of the resulting eligibility list. Any veteran who has been dishonorably discharged or released is not eligible for veterans' preference.
2. An entrance examination is defined, under the law, as any open competitive examination.
3. Veterans' Preference is not granted once a person achieves permanent civil service status.

GENERAL INFORMATION

The California Public Utilities Commission reserves the right to revise the examination plan to better meet the needs of the service if the circumstances under which this examination was planned change. Such revision will be in accordance with civil service law and rules and all competitors will be notified.

For an examination with a written feature, it is the candidate's responsibility to contact the California Public Utilities Commission three days prior to the written test date if he/she has not received his/her notice of appointment.

For an examination without a written feature, it is the candidate's responsibility to contact the California Public Utilities Commission three weeks after the final filing date if he/she has not received his/her notice.

If a candidate's notice of oral interview or performance test fails to reach him/her 3 days prior to their scheduled appointment due to a verified postal error, he/she will be rescheduled upon written request.

Examination Locations: When a written test is part of the examination, it will be given in such places in California as the number of candidates and conditions warrant. However, locations of interviews or performance evaluations may be limited or extended as conditions warrant.

Applications are available at the State Personnel Board office, local offices of the Employment Development Department, and in the Human Resources Office of the California Public Utilities Commission.

If you meet the requirements stated on this bulletin, you may take this examination, which is competitive. Possession of the entrance requirement does not assure a place on the eligible list. Your performance in the examination will be compared with the performance of the others who take this test, and all candidates who pass will be ranked according to their scores.

Candidates needing special testing arrangements due to a disability must mark the appropriate box on the application and/or contact the testing department.

General Qualifications: Candidates must possess essential personal qualifications including integrity, initiative, dependability, good judgment, and ability to work cooperatively with others; and a state of health consistent with the ability to perform the assigned duties of the class. A medical examination may be required. In open examinations, investigation may be made of employment records and personal history and fingerprinting may be required.

Eligible Lists: Eligible lists established by competitive examination, regardless of date, must be used in the following order: 1) sub-divisional promotional, 2) departmental promotional, 3) multi-departmental promotional, 4) service-wide promotional, 5) departmental open, 6) open. When there are two lists of the same kind, the older must be used first. Eligible lists will expire in one to four years unless otherwise stated on the bulletin.

If Promotional Examinations Only: Competition is limited to employees who have a permanent civil service appointment and military veterans that meet all the minimum qualifications. Under certain circumstances, other employees may be allowed to compete under provisions of Rules 234, 235, and 235.2. State Personnel Board Rules 233, 234, 235, 235.2, and 237 contain provisions regarding civil service status and eligibility for promotional examinations. These rules may be reviewed at departmental personnel offices, at the State Personnel Board office or jobs.ca.gov.

If High School Equivalence is Required: Equivalence to completion of the 12th grade may be demonstrated in any one of the following ways: 1) passing the General Educational Development (GED) Test; 2) completion of 12 semester units of college work; 3) certification from the State Department of Education, a local school board, or high school authorities that the candidate is considered to have education equivalent to graduation from high school; 4) for clerical and accounting classes, substitution of business college work in place of high school on a year-for-year basis.

College Education: The qualifications meeting the requirement "Equivalent to graduation from college" means satisfaction of the requirements for the bachelor's degree from an accredited, recognized institution of higher education. This means the applicant must show receipt of a bachelor's degree. Acceptable college course work must be from an accredited, recognized institution approved by the California Superintendent of Public Instruction under the provisions of California Education Code Section 94712.

Veterans' Preference Points: The California Department of Human Resources (CalHR) has information on how to apply for Veterans' Preference on their website at jobs.ca.gov and on the Application for Veterans' Preference form (CalHR 1093).
